The Canadian Hockey Officiating Program Supervisors' Code of Ethics provides guidance to supervisors across Canada. Officials should expect from supervisors the highest possible standards of integrity and honesty. The Supervisors' Code of Ethics is its public declaration of a supervisor's obligation to himself, the officials and the game.

I WILL ...

- ☛ Represent myself as professionally as possible;
- ☛ Be supportive to my Branch and the CHA;
- ☛ Endorse and support the CHA playing rules, Officiating Program policies and procedures;
- ☛ Support the philosophy and right of all hockey participants to "Fair Play";
- ☛ Remember that my role is to "coach" and "assist" the development of officials;
- ☛ Be honest in my comments to officials;
- ☛ Be calm and rational, firm but not emotional in my presentation to officials;
- ☛ Offer both praise and criticism in a constructive manner;
- ☛ Always show respect for my fellow supervisors, officials, the players, coaches and fans;
- ☛ Contribute to the continued growth of the Officiating Program and its officials within my Branch through support, encouragement and a positive attitude;
